

Investing for Success

Under this agreement for 2018 Mundingburra State School will receive

\$305,368*

This funding will be used to

- Maintain the number of students in NAPLAN upper two bands in Year 3 Reading above 50% and increase Year 3 Writing to above 30% (30% in 2017).
- Increase the number of students in NAPLAN upper two bands in Year 5 Reading from 28.7% to above 35% and Year 5 Writing from 4% to above 10%.
- Increase the percentage of Prep students reaching reading benchmarks from 77% (Semester 2 2017) to above 80% (Semester 2 2018).
- Close the gap by increasing the percentage of Indigenous Years 1-6 students receiving a C or better in English from 76% (Semester 1 2017) to over 85% (Semester 2 2018).

Our initiatives include

- Provide professional learning in 'Teaching with a literacy and numeracy focus' through co-planning, collaborative inquiry cycles and co-teaching to develop teachers' knowledge and understanding of the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics, and increasing their competency to identify and implement effective instructional strategies utilising the gradual release model.
- Provide time for teachers to analyse learning data and work samples with knowledgeable others to make decisions about the next instructional strategies required and the feedback to provide to students.
- Use Early Start data, OLEY (Oral Language for the Early Years), PMAP (Phonological Metalinguistic Awareness Program) and four lesson reading sequence in Prep to guide teachers and teacher aides in implementing high yield strategies for beginning readers and writers.
- Provide targeted intervention aligned to student needs and the curriculum.

Employ additional Support Teachers Literacy and Numeracy to work intensively with teachers and students to improve literacy and numeracy teaching and learning	210 000
Employ additional teacher aides to implement OLEY, PMAP, four lesson, sequence, guided reading, intensive support with speech and other literacy skills	59 300
Provide teachers with quality professional learning within and beyond the school, including shared planning, collaborative inquiry cycles and co-teaching opportunities	36 068
